Tax Change May Make This A Good Year To Purchase Equipment

Part of the federal economic stimulus package recently passed by Congress is designed to encourage small businesses to make capital expenditures in 2008.

The Section 179 deduction, which allows businesses purchasing less than \$800,000 in capital equipment—such as computers, office furniture, shop tools, or equipment—has nearly doubled for 2008 to \$250,000. That means that purchases up to that amount can be deducted upfront rather than depreciated over time.

Equipment like air conditioning or heating units, or structural parts of a building like replacement windows can't be deducted under Section 179. To qualify, the equipment also must be put into service (even if not paid for) by December 31.

Schmatz. "Vehicles are becoming increasingly sophisticated with virtually every system either monitored or controlled by computers. Servicing these vehicles to keep them in safe working condition requires ready access to complete

and accurate information from the car companies. Right to Repair ensures that car owners and their trusted repair shops have the same access to safety alerts and repair information as the franchised new car dealer network."

April Is National Car Care Month - A Good Time To Take Control Of Your Gas Expenses

April is National Car Care Month, the time of year to focus on taking better care of your second largest investment. Especially now, with record high gas prices, regular vehicle maintenance is even more important as it can increase gas mileage by as much as 10 percent, according to the Car Care Council.



"Consumers cannot control the price of gas at the pumps, but they can control the amount of gas they use," said Rich White, executive director, Car Care Council. "The condition of tires, air filters and spark plugs can impact fuel economy and these components can be easily checked on a regular basis."

During April, many auto repair shops and parts stores throughout the country celebrate National Car Care Month by offering special discounts on parts and service, handing out free Car Care Guides and hosting vehicle check-up events in the community. At these events, businesses volunteer their time to check components on vehicles that typically get overlooked, including tires, air filters, lubricants and fluids, belts and hoses, battery cables and lights. These free vehicle check-up events emphasize the importance of preventive maintenance and educate consumers about how to take proper care of their cars.

"Each year, car care events routinely identify that consumers are not taking proper care of their vehicles and in many cases, this amounts to spending more money at the pump than necessary," said White. "If you don't have the opportunity to visit a car care event in April, at least commit to having the vehicle checked on a regular basis to make sure it's running at optimal performance."

Revised Employment Eligibility Form I-9 Now Required By Law

The Department of Homeland Security, U.S. Citizenship & Immigration Service, has issued a revised Form I-9, Employment Eligibility Verification document. As of December 26, 2007, businesses are required by law to use the modified form for all new hires, even if they are United States citizens (employers are not required to complete a new form for existing employees). This document has been revised to decrease the number of documents required to confirm identity and employment eligibility.

OSHA Recordkeeping: Form 300A

OSHA's Form 300A, Summary of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses, must be posted from the prior year each February 1 through April 30. Be sure to update your OSHA Form 300 and retain any supporting documentation such as Work Comp Forms or OSHA Form 101s. An injury or illness must be work related and fall under at least one of the following four criteria to count as a recordable injury and illness:

1. Days away from work
2. Restricted work
3. Transfer to another job duty
4. Medical treatment beyond first aid

If you had more than 10 employees at any one time during the prior year, then you are required to keep OSHA 300 and 300A logs on file. For more information visit www.osha.gov/recordkeeping. ◇



AAIA Calls On Congress To Include Tax Credit For Vehicle Maintenance

Kathleen Schmatz, president and CEO, Automotive Aftermarket Industry Association (AAIA), called on the U.S. Congress to include in the economic stimulus package, that is now being debated, a tax credit to American car owners for actions they take to maximize the fuel efficiency of their vehicles. Schmatz pointed to a recently released Wall Street Journal/NBC News poll that found Americans cite gasoline prices as the economic woe that most affects them.

"Car owners should undertake proper vehicle maintenance, which would be the most effective step in reducing fuel consumption by their vehicle," Schmatz told Congress.

The letter, addressed to both the chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee, Rep. Charlie Rangel, D-N.Y. and the chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, Senator Max Baucus, D-Mont., highlighted information from the U.S. Department of Energy that "fixing a car that is noticeably out of tune or has failed an emissions test can improve its gas mileage by an average of 4 percent."

"With gas prices at more than \$3 per gallon in most parts of the country, any effort to reduce fuel costs for car owners will put more money into the pockets of Americans and maybe, more importantly, reduce our dependence on foreign oil," Schmatz said. "This will lead to reduced emissions of global warming gasses and ensure that vehicles are meeting federal and state emissions standards."

The provision recommended by AAIA would authorize the Department of the Treasury to work with the U.S. Environment Protection Agency (EPA) and the Department of Energy (DOE) to develop actions that could be undertaken by motorists to qualify for the credit. Examples listed in the letter include: changing air and fuel filters; replacing spark plugs; and any repairs necessary to turn off the vehicle malfunction indicators light that alerts motorists to an emissions-related problem.

"All of these actions would ultimately reduce gasoline consumption and improve the environment at the same time," Schmatz said. ◇





Aftermarket FastForward 2012 - AAIA Debuts New Groundbreaking Report
